

OUR HISTORY

Willem Charles, an independent missionary and natural-born citizen of Haiti, and his wife, Beth, a native of Indiana, founded Mountain Top Ministries in 1999 to realize a vision God had placed in their hearts: To share the good news of Jesus Christ with the people of Haiti by providing for their spiritual, academic and physical needs.

MTM's outreach to the people of Haiti, to the village of Gramothe in particular, is multi-faceted – each ministry entrusted with a mission to meet a particular need and reach people with the love of Christ in a powerful way.



“SEEK YE FIRST...”

In 1999, Willem Charles made a promise to the leaders in the village of Gramothe: “I’m going to build a church and a school here,” he said. Within a few months, Willem had raised \$7,000 and MTM completed construction of the 20’x20’ building that would serve the people for their church building and as their first school room.

Today, the gospel of Jesus Christ is being boldly proclaimed where it had once never been uttered. Even as a newborn church it was nearly full, with over 100 in attendance. Today, the MTM Gramothe Church ministers to the needs of over 500 people and remains a vital center of spiritual transformation as people gather to seek God and become active contributors to His work in their own nation.



EDUCATION

Education is essential to lasting positive change, though it is beyond reach for thousands here. MTM has strategically placed two schools in the remote villages of Gramothe and Dumay, where the needs of some of Haiti’s most marginalized children and young adults can be met.

From the humble beginnings of a one room church doubling as a classroom, to 12 primary classrooms, a kindergarten building and a high school, the MTM Gramothe School is proud to be graduating some of its first attending students.

With a total student body now numbering around 900, MTM continues to provide the youth from these villages with access to quality education and, with it, a hopeful future.



MEDICAL CLINIC

Haiti is the poorest nation in the Western Hemisphere. It is a constant struggle for most families to provide the basic necessities they need to survive. Many are in dire need of medical attention and absorb information about health care.

The MTM Gramothe Medical Clinic is where North Americans team up to bring health care education, treatment and provisions to the people of this region.

MTM practices practical ways of giving ownership to the people of Haiti. Changing a nation requires coming alongside of its people, undergirding and teaching them. MTM desires that those we minister to will pass their knowledge and blessings along to others.

From the beginning, the community of Gramothe was involved with the location of the first church, carrying supplies and helping to build. That same spirit has continued with other humanitarian projects, disaster relief and building that continues.
